

Our iconic Parkes radio telescope, affectionately known as The Dish, was built in a sheep paddock in 1961.

The 64-metre diameter telescope is used by the world's astronomers to search for answers to some of the Universe's greatest scientific questions.

In 2020, The Dish was officially recognised for its contribution to humankind's understanding of the Universe. It was added to Australia's National Heritage List.
